



ANUFC Anti-Smoking Policy

ANUFC subscribes to the rules and regulations of the FFA, Capital Football and ANU.

ANU REGULATIONS

In maintaining a smoke-free campus the ANU is seeking to encourage and support people to quit smoking and to protect vulnerable members of our community from incidental exposure to tobacco smoke.

The Smoke-Free policy was introduced in 2015 and bans all smoking (including e-cigarettes/vaping) on campus at all locations. The only exception being signposted Designated Outdoor Smoking Areas (DOSA).

The ANU Smoke Free Policy prohibits smoking (including e-cigarettes/vaping) and the use of tobacco products in all vehicles on campus and ANU vehicles being used for business purposes elsewhere. The Policy prohibits the promotion, and advertising of tobacco products on University's lands and prohibits any tobacco-industry funded activities.

CAPITAL FOOTBALL REGULATIONS

It is prohibited for anyone to smoke or consume alcohol within the confines of the playing barrier fence. This includes the team bench within the Technical Area and anywhere on or within ten metres of the touchline. Failure to comply with this Rule will render a fine at the level of BR4 under Schedule 1 of these Rules and may be further penalised by CF

Clubs are responsible for ensuring that smoking and drinking alcohol are confined to legitimate public areas (which includes non-smoking in permanent seating) at a distance no less than ten metres from the playing field.

If any person is in breach of this Rule, both the individual and if the person is a Club Associate, that person's Club, may be fined at level BR5 under Schedule 1 of the competition regulations and face disciplinary action under the CFDDR.

FFA REGULATIONS

The FFA No Smoking policy as contained in the FFA Member Protection Policy applies to all levels of football:

- No smoking shall occur at or near any sporting event or competition involving persons under the age of 18, and this Policy applies to all coaches, players, trainers, officials and volunteers.
- Social functions shall be smoke free, with smoking permitted at designated outdoor smoking areas.
- Coaches, officials, trainers, volunteers and players will refrain from smoking and remain smoke free while involved in an official capacity for any Governing Body, Club or Representative team, on and off the field.

NO SMOKING SIGNS

- No-smoking signage at sports grounds is not compulsory however it is recommended that No Smoking signs be displayed at grounds and venues to assist in the awareness of the regulations. No Smoking information should also be included in newsletters, websites and event programs.
